



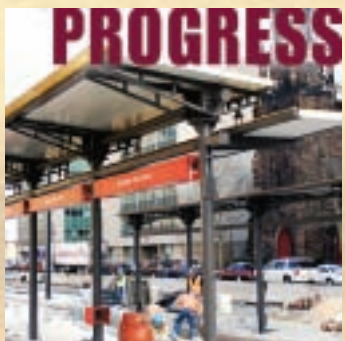
The Newark City Subway Extension links Newark Penn and Newark Broad Street stations with the Downtown Newark business district in 10 minutes or less. Combined with the Newark Broad Street Station renovation and the relocation and widening of Route 21 by the New Jersey Department of Transportation, these projects will greatly improve your commute in Newark and contribute to the renaissance of the state's largest city.



OFFERING frequent service starting in summer 2006, six NJ TRANSIT rail lines and dozens of bus lines will offer you connections to the new one-mile extension of the Newark City Subway at Newark Penn and Newark Broad Street stations.

IF you are an existing Newark City Subway customer boarding at a station in Bloomfield, Belleville or Newark, you can easily connect to the extension at Newark Penn Station.

IF you work downtown, the extension will give you improved access to Verizon, IDT and many other businesses near and along the Broad Street commercial district. If you're looking for recreational or entertainment opportunities, the extension will take you to the New Jersey Performing Arts Center, Bears and Eagles Riverfront Stadium, The Newark Museum, the future Newark Arena, and trains and buses to Newark Liberty International Airport. Also, you can connect to Amtrak and PATH at Newark Penn Station.



TO date, most work on track, signal and overhead electrical wires has been completed. We are wrapping up work on five new station platforms, canopies above the platforms, and state-of-the-art passenger communications systems.

TESTING of overhead electrical wires and support systems is underway. Integrated system testing using light rail cars will begin in April, including the operation of light rail cars along downtown streets.

THIS will be the first time in decades that Newark City Subway cars have operated along Newark city streets. It is important that you stay alert and use caution when walking or driving through Newark. Please follow the safety tips mentioned below:

- ◆ Be aware that light rail cars operate quietly.
- ◆ Look both ways before crossing the tracks, and only cross at designated street or pedestrian crossings.
- ◆ Observe all traffic signals and grade crossing protection devices at street intersections.
- ◆ Do not walk along light rail tracks.
- ◆ Stay away from overhead electrical wires and the poles that support them to avoid the risk of electrocution.

Extreme Makeover for Newark Broad Street Station



A \$50.8 million renovation project is underway at Newark Broad Street Station. Scheduled for completion in early 2008, the work includes installation of new high-level platforms, two elevators, six new sets of stairs, walkway improvements, a new public address system and

electronic passenger information displays, two ADA-accessible bathrooms, upgrades to the main waiting room, new enclosed waiting areas and canopies on the outbound platform, improved lighting and signage, and a new Customer Service Office.
